

CANADIAN LIFEGUARD CHALLENGE INFORMATION PACKAGE Prepared 2016-07-18

Purpose	To provide a high performance surf lifesaving competition in the years between the Lifesaving World Championships.
	To increase participation at the Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championships.
Invitational Competition:	An invitational competition for high performance athletes.
	Hosted by the Lifesaving Society Nova Scotia.
	Sanctioned by the Lifesaving Society Canada.
	Event rules in accordance with Section 4 of the 2015–2019 ILS Competition Rule Book.
Date:	Sunday August 6, 2017
Location:	Martinique Beach, Nova Scotia
Eligibility for an Invitation to Participate	 To be eligible to compete in the Canadian Lifeguard Challenge, competitors shall: Hold a current (within 24 months of the date of certification) Lifesaving Society Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross or National Lifeguard certification (any option). Be a registered athlete with the Lifesaving Society Canada. Finish in the top 8 places of the Open Division Oceanman/Oceanwoman event at the 2016 Canadian Surf Lifesaving Championship (CSLC), or Finish in the top 3 places of the Youth Division (16 – 19 years) Oceanman/Oceanwoman event at the 2016 CSLC, or Finish in the top 3 places of the Open Division Board Race, Swim Race or Surf Ski Race at the 2016 CSLC. Eligible athletes will receive an invitation to compete in the Canadian Lifeguard Challenge to be held on August 6, 2017.
Program of Events	 The Canadian Lifeguard Challenge is 3 consecutive Oceanwoman /Oceanman events. Round 1 is a traditional Oceanman/Oceanwoman course. The order of legs is ski – board – swim. Round 2 is an M -shaped Oceanman/Oceanwoman course. The order of legs is swim – ski – board. Round 3 is a traditional Oceanman/Oceanwoman course. The order of legs is board – swim – ski.

	The time between each female round, is the time required to complete the male round. I.E. The 2 nd female round starts when the last male crosses the finish line in round one.
	The time between each male round, is the time required to complete the female round. I.E. The 1st male round starts when the last female crosses the finish line in round one.
	Males and females compete on the same course. The male and female Oceanman/Oceanwoman rounds shall be run consecutively. See schedule.
Draws for Position	For each round, starting position shall be determined by random draw. Starting positions shall be consecutively numbered from the left (facing the water) starting with the number 1.
Scoring	Competitors shall be allocated the following points in each round. Final rankings shall be determined by the total points accumulated from each of the 3 rounds. 1st place
Awards and Reception	Awards shall be presented at a reception following the competition. Food will be served. Male and female awards shall be presented to the first 8 places in the Canadian
	Lifeguard Challenge.

Registration and Numbering	Invited competitors will be required to submit a registration form and a waiver/release form by July 15, 2017.
	Competitors are required to have their competitor number applied to their upper left and right arm and upper left and right thigh.
Race Singlets	Canadian Lifeguard Challenge Lycra singlets must be worn by all competitors. Noncompliance will result in disqualification.
	Singlets will be provided to all competitors and become the property of the competitor at the end of the competition.
Equipment and	All competitors must provide their own craft.
Handlers	All craft must meet ILS specifications.
	All competitors must have an equipment handler who is knowledgeable in the event rules and their role as an equipment handler.
	Competitors are required to have their craft ready in the designated position prior to the start of the race. The start of each round shall not be delayed if competitors equipment is not available or not in position. Each round shall start at the predetermined, designated time.

	Oceanwoman Round 3 will start at approximately1:30 p.m.
	Oceanman Round 3 will start at approximately1:45 p.m.

	An accommodation booking will be scheduled for the evenings of August 5 and August 6, at a hotel in Dartmouth.
	Competitors will receive a \$100 accommodation subsidy.

Meals	Competitors are responsible for their own food and hydration. Competitors will receive a \$100 meal subsidy.
