## Pool Operator - Level 1

### What is the Pool Operator – Level 1 course about?

The Lifesaving Society Pool Operator Level 1 course is designed to review safe water management practices and procedures to prepare and certify candidates to operate swimming pools in a safe and efficient manner.

#### Who should take the course?

Full time and seasonal personnel including: facility managers, pool operators, aquatic supervisors, and maintenance personnel will benefit from this program.

Prerequisite: None.

Successful candidates earn Lifesaving Society Pool Operator – Level 1 certification.

### What you learn

- □ Knowledge of the principle contaminants and treatment systems of pool and spa systems for both Class A and B Pools.
- □ A practical hands-on approach for solving typical water treatment problems.
- Design and type of pool and the impact of maintenance planning.
- □ Safety and risk management approaches to swimming pool operations.
- Knowledge and resources to plan and maintain swimming pool according to the health regulations.
- □ The implications of Recreation Water Illness and concepts of pool air quality.
- □ Practical knowledge of pool design in order to maintain swimming pools.

#### Is there a course text?

The text for the course is the Lifesaving Society *Pool Operations Manual*. This 150 page text outlines operating standards for public swimming pools in Ontario and explains the mechanisms to ensure these standards can be achieved. Participants also receive the Lifesaving Society *Pool Operator Workbook*.
