The Lifesaving Society Pool Operator Level 1 course is designed to review safe water management practices and procedures to prepare and certify candidates to operate swimming pools in a safe and efficient manner.

Who should take the course?

Full time and seasonal personnel including: facility managers, pool operators, aquatic supervisors, and maintenance personnel will benefit from this program.

Prerequisite: None.

Successful candidates earn Lifesaving Society Pool Operator – Level 1 certification.

- ❑ A practical hands-on approach for solving typical water treatment problems.

Is there a course text?

Pool Operator – Level 2

What is the Pool Operator – Level 2 course about?

Lifesaving Society Pool Operator Level 2 prepares and certifies candidates to operate swimming pools in a safe and efficient manner. The Level 2 course includes details discussions about the management of safe water, pool filtration, pool equipment, operations and maintenance.

Who should take the course?

This course is designed for anyone responsible for the hands-on operation of a swimming pool. Full time and seasonal personnel including: facility managers, pool operators, aquatic supervisors, and maintenance personnel will benefit from this program.

Prerequisite: Lifesaving Society Pool Operator Level 1 or equivalent certification.

Successful candidates earn Lifesaving Society Pool Operator - Level 2 certification.
