Modifying swimming lessons for swimmers with different abilities

Teaching swimming lessons to swimmers with varying abilities can be overwhelming. However, if you're prepared, it can be a great experience! Use these tips to help ensure everyone has a good time in class.

Set realistic expectations

Talk to your swimmer and their caregiver(s) to set realistic expectations. For some, it may mean that it will take longer or require more practice to achieve a skill, which is perfectly fine as everyone learns at their own pace.

Read the Purpose Statements

The Society recognizes that some individuals may be unable to achieve all the must-sees, but if they can complete the item with modifications safely or can achieve the purpose statement, then you may consider that a "pass." If you have questions about the must sees or purpose statements, speak with your Deck Supervisor for support in modifying the requirements to ensure that the appropriate material is taught.

Ensure safety

To help reinforce appropriate behaviours during swim lessons, remind swimmers of rules every class, and ensure that there are clear and well-defined expectations. Sometimes, a swimmer may be non-responsive to verbal direction or forget the pool rules, so in that case, try talking to the individual's caregiver(s) about ideas and suggestions that work at home.

Try rewards and games

Swimmers are often motivated by rewards. Here are some ways you can modify rewards and games to suit adapted participants:

- When using rewards, be clear about which action earns which reward. For example, if a participant does 5 bobs, then they get to go down the slide 2 times.
- Speak with caregiver(s) about what reward systems they use at home.
- Play lots of games! Use them to make your classes fun and to reinforce the skills participants need to succeed!

Teaching swimmers with different abilities requires a little extra preparation and flexibility, but it can turn out to be very fun and rewarding! With these tips, you can manage it confidently! For extra information, please consult our Inclusion Policy.

2025 ONTARIO NON-FATAL DROWNING REPORT

In Ontario, non-fatal drowning results in an average of 585 emergency department visits each year. Non-fatal drowning is approximately four times more common than fatal drowning. The 2025 Ontario Non-Fatal Drowning Report provides an up-to-date snapshot of drowning-related emergency department visits and hospitalizations within the province. This data help us better understand the true burden of drowning in Ontario, including who is most at risk.

Verification of Identity Policy updates to support our affiliates

After reviewing the Verification of Identity Policy originally communicated on July 31, 2025, and consulting with instructors, affiliates, and other parties, we are making several important updates to better support program delivery in across aquatic settings.

These changes are designed to enhance flexibility for affiliates while continuing to uphold the integrity and standards of our courses.

Summary of key changes

- Attestation Form removed: The requirement to submit an attestation form has been eliminated.
- Original, copy, or digital copies now accepted: You may now use a copy of identification documents.

These updates aim to streamline the verification process and reduce administrative barriers, especially in remote or resource-limited environments.

Making a Splash

Bundling programs in the City of Guelph

Becoming a lifeguard and/or swim instructor requires a serious commitment of time, money and dedication. The City of Guelph knows this well and saw an opportunity to make the process more affordable, straightforward and efficient. They created the Aquatics Leadership Academy to help aspiring aquatic staff in their community become certified and build knowledge, skills and competence in and around the pool.

The Academy launched in March 2025. For a one-time fee of \$300, participants can register for all five core leadership courses (Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross, Standard First Aid, National Lifeguard, and Swim and Lifesaving Instructor). The fee is a fraction of the cost of registering for each course individually and also includes access to lane swims and dropin skill development sessions, allowing candidates to practise and get real-time feedback from instructors.

The program has seen great success and has already created a pipeline for the City of Guelph to hire qualified individuals at their pools. "The program has welcomed 285 participants since its launch, with several already joining our aquatics team," says Breann R., Recreation Supervisor, Aquatics. "As the Academy grows, we look forward to training even more enthusiastic individuals who will help deliver high-quality aquatic programs across our recreation centres."

One graduate, Nora, raved about her experience. "The Academy saved me so much money and made it easier to finish my certifications faster. The included lane swims helped me keep up my endurance, and the entire process was more efficient and affordable," she said. "I highly recommend it to anyone considering becoming a lifeguard or instructor."

Guelph's Aquatics Leadership Academy has proven to be a great way to enhance the Society's programming and engage its community. The Academy is open to anyone aged 13 or older, and registration for the courses must be completed before March 2027.
